None of her sorority sisters know her backstory. Now, she wishes to create a more inclusive and normative environment for other women like her in the NPC. Tasha Vanderson

Coming from a low income background has made it extremely difficult for Tasha to maintain her involvement in her sorority. Though she is the president and works extremely hard to decrease dues as much as possible she has found that her efforts have made a meager dent. Hence, she is hoping to work with the NPC to find a better, more fruitful solution to ensure that sisterhood is not limited to those who have the ability to pay for it.
